2018 Projects & Goals

ACIH will be moving its national office to Southern California University of Health Sciences



We had several excellent universities apply to house ACIH. We were fortunate to have had this level of interest. This move will take place in Spring of 2018 and we are now in our national search for our next Executive Director as **Elizabeth (Liza) Goldblatt, PhD, MPA/HA**, ACIH Acting Executive Director, will return to the ACIH Board as a founding member.

From our inception in 2004, the ED worked virtually, and for ACIH to create more sustainability and visibility, we have decided to move our office onto one of the campuses in order to further our mission and vision. We are a small non-profit educational organization and being housed at a university will bring benefits to both ACIH and the host university. We look forward to this important change in our organizational maturation.

National Academy of Medicine Global Forum for Innovations in Health Professional Education – April 26-27, 2018 Workshop

Our work with the Global Forum is going exceedingly well. Last November, Dr. Goldblatt co-facilitated with **Kennita Carter**, **MD** (HRSA) a break-out session on building resilience, health and wellbeing in



preparation for the April 2018 Global Forum workshop that will entirely focus on organizational and individual resilience, health and well-being and how to work with and institutionally address stress and burn-out. The National Academy of Medicine's board approved the 'Statement of Task' and endorses the importance of this timely subject. This workshop will be held April 26 -27, 2018. Please mark your calendars. ACIH leaders are taking a major role on planning and participating in this workshop.

In addition to being on the planning committee, **John Weeks**, former ACIH ED and **Liza Goldblatt** were successful in having **Mary Jo Kreitzer**, **PhD**, **RN** (Consortium leader) cochair the planning committee and **Adi Haramati**, **PhD** and **Maryanna Klatt**, **PhD** (both long-time Consortium leaders) are on the planning Committee.











The April 2018 workshop is a culmination of our work with the Global Forum as we continually educate the 50+ national health professional organizational representatives who attend these meetings about who we are and how we contribute to building

2018 will include a major focus on our upcoming project with the Academic Consortium for Integrative Medicine and Health (the 'Consortium')

We are currently working with the Consortium to create a 36-hour hybrid course that will focus on training the ACIH disciplines last year students, residents and practitioners to work in integrative conventional medical in and out-patient settings. In addition, this course will include a training component in IPE/CP for all the health professionals who work in the integrative medicine and health settings. 30 hours will be online and 6 hours in person. Academy of Integrative Health & Medicine Conference – Fall 2017

Bill Meeker, DC, ACIH Board member attended an important meeting, also held in San Diego shortly before the AIHM conference, of several national organizations that have decided to come together and focus on **integrative pain management** and put a strong emphasis on the non-pharmaceutical approaches to pain management.

University of Arizona National Center for Integrative Primary Healthcare

ACIH has been part of the leadership team that developed the National Center for Integrative Primary Healthcare competencies and course. Individual modules are now available for either educational institutions or individual health professionals to take. See www.nciph.org. This is a course for primary care integrative health providers and includes LAc's, DC's and ND's, who for this project, are considered primary care in the broadest sense of practice and is also in accord with the WHO broad definition. Dr. Goldblatt is on the NCIPH leadership team.
